Dear Ms. Cooper,

Following the issue of the agreed Statement of Common Ground between Newark and Sherwood District Council, English Heritage and National Trust I am now, as anticipated, able to up date the written statement submitted on behalf of National Trust on 29<sup>th</sup> November 2012.

Specifically:

- ❖ Question 19 – as previously noted there are no matters relating to this Question that the Trust wishes to raise.
- ❖ Question 20 – in effect the submitted Statement of Common Ground has now resolved the matters raised by the National Trust that are covered by this Question. Accordingly other than to answer any questions that the Inspector may have in relation to the Statement of Common Ground or the related Further Proposed Modifications as issued by the Council on 29<sup>th</sup> November 2012, there are no matters that National Trust wishes to address at the Hearing Session.
- ❖ Question 21 – the National Trust's objections remain outstanding and the Trust would wish to discuss these before the Inspector at the Hearing Session on 13<sup>th</sup> December.

We therefore thank the Council and English Heritage for their work to resolve those matters of 'common ground' and propose to attend the Hearing with specific reference to the Southwell bypass – Question 21.
