

Provision of Food, Drink and alcohol in On-Licensed Premises
The Health Protection (Coronavirus, Restrictions) (England)
(No 4) Regulations 2020

The regulations prohibit the sale of food, drink and alcohol for consumption on the premises.

Provision of food and drink (including alcohol) may be provided for consumption off the premise, subject to specific requirements as outlined below:

Food and/or drink (No alcohol)

Between the hours of 05:00 and 22:00 a premises may sell food or drink for take-away, and the customer **can enter the premises** to collect the food or drink.

Between 22:00 till 05:00 the next morning, premises may sell and food and drink, but each sale **must be pre-ordered**

- Through a website or other on-line communication
- By telephone (including text messages)
- By post

and only made via a delivery, a drive-thru facility or collected by a customer. The customer **must not enter the premises** or if collected by vehicle must not vacate their vehicle

Alcohol

A premises may sell alcohol **at any time** but **every sale must be pre-ordered**

- Through a website or other on-line communication
- By telephone (including text messages)
- Or by post

and only made via a delivery, a drive-thru facility or collected by a customer. The customer **must not enter the premises** or if collected by vehicle must not vacate their vehicle

It is important to note that the Regulations do not override the hours and conditions of each individual premises licence and operators must remain compliant with those times and conditions.

Off licences, supermarkets and convenience stores are exempt from the above as they are not business's that is required to close, however they are still subject to their current premises licence hours and conditions.

Off-sales permissions under the Business and Planning Act

Please note that due to the above regulations prohibiting on-sales, S11 of the Business and Planning Act cannot be used to authorize off-sales whilst the regulations are in force.

Temporary Event Notices (TENs)

TEN's may continue to be served to authorise off-sales for retailers trading at bone-fide markets.

Note: Off Licensed premises are not a restricted business under the above regulations
