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Summary

In April 2022, Archaeology England Ltd carried out a geophysical survey at land to the west of Kelham, Nottinghamshire at the request of The Sirius Group.

The aim of the geophysical survey was to determine the nature and extent of any buried archaeological features located within 53 hectares of land centred on SK 76640 55525. A further 18 hectares to the east of the proposed development site were surveyed in February 2021 (see Muller & Garcia Rovira 2021). The remaining field—Field D—was surveyed in December 2022, once the ground conditions were adequate for the survey.

The survey identified anomalies of probable archaeological origin in Fields A, B and C, which directly link to cropmarks evidenced in aerial photography and recorded in the Historic Environment Records (HER) and National Mapping Programme (NMP). No archaeological activity was recorded during the survey in the NE region of the field.

The work was carried out to the Standard and Guidance set out by the Chartered Institute for Archaeologists for Archaeological Geophysical Survey (CIfA 2015) and completed in accordance with EAC Guidelines for the Use of Geophysics in Archaeology (Historic England 2016).

1. Introduction

- 1.1. From the 5th to the 28th of April 2022, Archaeology England (AE) Ltd carried out the second stage of work of a geophysical survey at land to the west of Kelham, Nottinghamshire (NRG SK 76640 55525) (Figure 1-2). This stage was preceded by Stage 1, carried out in February 2021, and documented in AE Report 1954 (see Muller and Garcia Rovira 2021 –see Appendix I), and followed by Stage 3 (December 2022) documented on the present report (Figure 2).
- 1.2. The survey was undertaken as part of a staged approach of archaeological investigations into a wider scheme. The aim of the survey was to provide a better understanding of the nature and precise location of the archaeological resource of the area.
- 1.3. The work was managed by Irene Garcia Rovira MCIfA, AE Project Manager, and the site work was undertaken by Jennifer Muller, Jessica Woolley, Jack Dowling, Daniel Morgan, Rosie Griffin, and Caroline Sims.
- 1.4. All work conformed to the *Standard and Guidance for Geophysical Survey* (CIfA update 2020) and was undertaken by suitably qualified staff to the highest professional standards.

2. Site description and geology

- 2.1. The surveyed area is located to the west of the village of Kelham, Nottinghamshire and c. 3.8km to the northeast of Newark-upon-Trent. The surveyed area is currently used for agricultural purposes; it two large, irregular fields and two smaller fields, bounded to the east by Broadgate Late, to the north and west by a number of fields of small and medium size, and to the south by the A617 (Fields A-D –Figure 2).
- 2.2. The underlying geology of the site is comprised of mudstone belonging to the Mercia Mudstone Group. This sedimentary bedrock was formed approximately 201 to 252 million years ago in the Triassic Period. The bedrock is overlain with superficial deposits of sand and gravel belonging to the Holme Pierrepont Sand and Gravel Member, with bands of recorded alluvium along ditched waterways (BGS 2022).

3. Aims and Objectives

- 3.1. The geophysical survey was undertaken in order to locate and describe archaeological features that may be present within the survey area. A number of archaeological features are known to exist within and adjacent to the surveyed fields in the form of cropmarks/soilmarks evidenced in aerial photography and recorded as Historic Environment Records (HERs) (Figure 19). The cropmarks are recorded by the National Mapping Programme (NMP) (Figure 3; see Section 5).
- 3.2. It is the aim of this report to provide information from the results obtained in Stage 2 and 3 which is sufficiently detailed to allow the archaeological resource to be better understood. The results will test out the potential/limitations of the proposed development within the selected area and will be key to future development designs.

4. Methodology

Geophysical Survey

4.1. The survey was carried out using a Bartington Grad601-2 dual sensor fluxgate gradiometer. This instrument has been chosen due to its proven efficient and effective method of locating sub-surface archaeological anomalies on greenfield sites. The machine consists of two high stability fluxgate sensors suspended on a single frame, accurately aligned, that can detect localised magnetic anomalies compared with the general magnetic background. When mapped in a systematic manner this allows changes in the magnetic field resulting from differing features in the soil to be plotted. Strong magnetic anomalies will be generated by iron-based objects or areas modified by heat, such as hearths and kilns. More subtle anomalies may be generated by changes, typically in the iron-oxide content, of underlying soils, compared to the natural subsoil. This enables the detection of material infilling sub-surface archaeological features such as ditches, pits and structural remains. Data from this may be mapped at closely spaced regular intervals, to produce an image that may be interpreted to locate buried archaeological features (Clark, 1997; Aspinall et al 2011).

- 4.2. Moreover, Fluxgate gradiometry has the advantage of being able to identify the broadest range of sub-surface archaeological feature types and can detect such anomalies at a range of soil depths (typically 0.3-1m).
- 4.3. The site was located by GPS. All survey points were located with the GPS and plotted onto an O.S. base map. Detailed survey was carried out in grids of 30m x 30m along zig-zag and parallel traverses spaced at 1m intervals, recording data points spaced at 0.25m intervals to a maximum instrument sensitivity of 0.1nT in accordance with Historic England Guidelines. The survey mode was set to bi-directional (traverses walked alternately northeast/southwest). Incomplete survey lines resulting from irregular area boundaries or obstacles were completed using the 'dummy log' key. At regular intervals, the data was downloaded in the field onto a laptop computer for storage and assessment.

<u>Data Processing and Presentation</u>

- 4.4. Following the completion of the detailed survey, processing and analysis took place using the TerraSurveyor v.3 software package.
- 4.5. A composite of each detailed survey area has been created and processed using TerraSurveyor v.3.0.37.1. The report includes raw and unclipped data in greyscale. Every effort has been made to reduce the instrument directional sensitivity in the field rather than reliance on post data-collection processing.
- 4.6. The final results have been presented at an appropriate scale tied to the Ordnance Survey National Grid.
- 4.7. The most typical method of visualising the data is as a greyscale image. In a greyscale plot, each data point is represented as a shade of grey, from black to white at extreme of the data range. A limited number of standard operations can be carried out to process the data, including clipping, destriping and graduated shade. The data was analysed using a variety of parameters and styles and the most useful of these were saved as *TIF images and displayed using Adobe Illustrator software. The results of the survey were then overlaid onto a digital map of the study area. This was then used to produce interpretation figures.

4.8. All works were undertaken in accordance with the standard required by The Chartered Institute for Archaeologist's *Standard and Guidance for Archaeological Geophysical Survey* (update 2020) and current Health and Safety legislation.

5. Known archaeological assets

- 5.1. In November 2021, Archaeology England carried out a Desk Based Assessment (DBA) for the proposed development (Garcia Rovira 2021).
- 5.2. The DBA highlighted the importance that the River Trent and its floodplains had in different times of the history of development of Kelham and its surroundings.
- 5.3. The river was a rich resource during prehistoric times. Furthermore, it is known that the Trent Valley was densely occupied during the Roman period, and it is likely that further settlement may be located W of Kelham Hall where the land is less susceptible to periodical flooding.
- 5.4. The historic map regression highlighted the patterns of development of the fields contained within the proposed development site over time. The large fields documented in the early 1800s are divided into multiple parcels by the 1880s; a situation changes around the 1970s with the advent of intensive farming.
- 5.5. A number of cropmarks and soilmarks are known to exist within and around the area surveyed (Figure 3 and 19). While they certainly represent the remains of past landscapes, little is known about their nature and character. However, a field evaluation carried out by Phoenix Consulting Archaeology Ltd at Flash Farm (adjacent to the site) indicated that a large proportion of the features dated to the Iron Age and Roman chronologies. Some isolated features of Bronze Age date were also recorded (Edwards 2015).

6. Geophysics results

Limitations

- 6.1. Stage 2 (Fields A-C) was undertaken during a period of mostly mild to warm weather with occasional rain and strong winds. Contrastingly, Stage 3 (Field D) took place in December 2022, with dry but icy weather conditions.
- 6.2. Certain situations on site created health and safety risks. Therefore, these situations were avoided when necessary. Examples include areas with deep tractor tyre marks; unkempt areas of grassland within which uneven ground was not clearly visible; and areas in fields with large, hard lumps of clay impeding walking. Field D contained areas of crops and deep tractor ruts toward the centre and south of Field D causing small data irregularities. In the limited situations, the 'dummy log' key was used, and no data collected.

Results (Figures 6-18)

- 6.3. The four fields comprising the survey are designated as Fields A-D (Figure 2). The survey identified anomalies of probable archaeological origin in all fields. These and other visible anomalies will be described below in the order they were surveyed (from north to south see Figure 2). Note that Field D was only partly surveyed during Stage 2 (April 2022) and revisited in December 2022. Figure 4 documents the results of Stage 1-3 surveys.
- 6.4. The survey recorded large spreads of magnetic debris throughout the site.

 This is comprised of many dipolar anomalies, which are positive points with a negative response, or vice versa. The grouping together of this debris reveals bands of magnetic sands and gravel running through the fields, especially in Fields A and C.
- 6.5. Other, single dipolar anomalies recorded throughout the survey may represent either isolated ferrous detritus, or thermoremanent magnetic materials, such as fragments of burnt stone, brick or tile.

Field A (Figures 7-9)

6.6. Anomalies characteristic of archaeological features, possibly ditches or gullies, were detected in two locations within Field A. Interpretation of these features is problematic due to the faintness of the anomalies caused either

- by the magnetic disturbance from high susceptibility of the soil, and/or potential depth of soil sequences. However, the anomalies correspond with cropmarks recorded by the Historic England NMP.
- 6.7. At the centre of Field A are several positive magnetic curvilinear anomalies grouped together (F1) in various versions of sub-circles, with three adjacent, positive linear anomalies all running parallel in a northeast/southwest direction. Positive magnetic anomalies (visible as black) usually represent cut, in-filled features, in which a greater amount of magnetic topsoil has collected compared to the subsoil into which it has been cut; negative magnetic anomalies (visible as white) display a lower magnetic response than the soil around them and are often indicative of the remains of positive landforms, such as earthen banks.
- 6.8. Within the most distinct sub-circular anomaly is a slightly negative response.

 This could indicate a slightly raised area within the anomaly.
- 6.9. Towards the northeast end of Field A is another series of faint, positive magnetic linear anomalies (F2) grouped in a northwest-southeast alignment along the eastern border and spread over a length of at least 110m. Though most of F2 are faint, the prevalence of anomalies here shows a certain amount of activity.

Field B (Figures 10-12)

- 6.10. A number of well-defined, magnetically positive anomalies indicative of archaeological pit and ditch features were located within Field B. Accompanying these are several fainter, positive linear anomalies potentially of an archaeological nature due to their location and relation to the other anomalies. All the anomalies are grouped together in one particular area, at the south-eastern edge of the field along the tree line.
- 6.11. This large grouping of magnetically positive anomalies consists of linears, curvilinears, and some positive points. They generally spread out in a northeast/southwest orientation. The recorded anomalies connect to others identified in an earlier survey (Garcia Rovira and Muller 2021) and are displayed together for cohesion.

- 6.12. The positive linear at the west end, set slightly apart from the group, is an incomplete rectangular ditch anomaly (F3). Within it, spaced equidistant from each end, are two positive points, indicative of infilled, cut features. Further within the enclosure are three more positive points of note spaced somewhat regularly from each other in a circular fashion (F4); these points could represent pits or postholes. Because of the pipeline to the northwest, it is difficult to determine whether the enclosure continues; the strong responses from the pipe will mask anomalies near it. The northern end of this ditched anomaly is cut off abruptly by a modern feature (within the green square indicating dummy values), which is a man-made mound with a pipe sticking vertically out of it.
- 6.13. The well-defined series of positive linear anomalies just to the east of the rectangular anomaly are especially pronounced due to their stronger magnetic susceptibility and because of the corresponding negative response visible on one or both sides of the linears (F5). Within the enclosed areas of these anomalies are other positive linear anomalies that may represent building activity. The white, or negative responses could represent raised surfaces, such as a ridge between ditches or a packed earth area that is made from the fill of the ditches. A positive circular anomaly was identified in the southern corner of these linears which has a diameter of approximately 10m (F6).
- 6.14. Faint positive curvilinear anomalies (F7) run in various directions immediately south-east of the rectangular enclosure and further north-east along the tree line. Their placement immediately next to these other anomalies may indicate a relation to them; however, they may simply represent different phases of activity. There are two sets of faint positive linear anomalies that run parallel to each other (F8 and F9), which could represent trackways. However, there is no evidence of any different type of surface between these to confirm that.
- 6.15. There are also a number of positive points amongst these linear features which could be pits or postholes (F10).

6.16. Only some of the former field boundaries were identified in Field B, as were faint plough marks (a sample marked in green). A bipolar linear, one that has strong alternating positive and negative responses, runs through the field in a general northeast/southwest direction; this is a modern service pipe and cuts through the anomalies in two places, at its southwest end and northeast end where it cuts under the man-made hill.

Field C (Figures 13-15)

- 6.17. The soil susceptibility in Field C was significantly different the other fields. Faintly visible are plough marks (a sample annotated in green), as well as a prevalence of pit-like, positive points throughout. As these positive points are spread throughout the field, they could be natural features.
- 6.18. There are two areas of interest within Field C, one of which was not identified in the NMP. On the northwest side of the field a positive linear anomaly was noted (F11); it is visible for approximately 25m and is orientated in a northwest/southeast direction. At its southern end it curves almost 90 degrees to the left (or south-west). There is another, fainter positive linear anomaly located just after it curves. However, this other anomaly has a fainter response, and may not be connected as it is in a slightly different alignment and could be a natural feature.
- 6.19. On the east side of Field C and running into the edge of the field next to the A617, is a series of positive linear anomalies curving into each other (F12). Some of these are visible on the NMP. Whether these are part of a field system or a farmstead, there appear to be two possible breaks or openings in the lines (F13 and F14), which may represent entrances.

Field D (Figures 16-18)

6.20. Field 4 was partially surveyed in May 2022. Within the results are the possible remains of a land drain (marked in green) and a large, magnetically strong amorphous anomaly at the eastern edge of the field. At about 140m in length and various widths, this anomaly does not appear to be

- archaeological in nature, but rather the remains of something more modern spread out in the field, e2like perhaps the remains of burned material.
- 6.21. From 5-8 December 2022, the southern half of Field D was surveyed. The condition of the field –due to crops still being present in the centre and southern end of the field, as well as deep tractor ruts filled with water and algae in other areas –resulted in data irregularities. However, this did not hinder interpretation.
- 6.22. What is most apparent is the former field boundary running northeast-southwest with a curve to the northeast at it centre. This is an historic field boundary with trackway or road running alongside it, visible in the OS Six-Inch Map from 1884. This boundary was in place at least until the 1950s. Also evident from the 1884 map are numerous other historic field boundaries within the current field. There are a couple of areas where these might be visible, towards the southern centre of the field, and directly west of that at the furthest west end of the field. The OS Six-inch England and Wales, 1842-1952, published in 1921, is the last map to show these other boundaries. All but one other disappeared by the time the OS 1:25,000 maps of Great Britain, 1945-1971, was published in 1951.

7. Discussion and conclusions

- 7.1. The works carried out by Archaeology England in April and December 2022 focused on surveying 56 hectares of land located to the west of Kelham, known to hold archaeological potential. The aim of the survey was to establish with further precision the location and nature of the archaeological remains.
- 7.2. The survey identified four areas with anomalies characteristic of archaeological features in Fields A, B and C. These anomalies correlated with cropmarks recorded by the National Mapping Programme (NMP) carried out by Historic England (see Figure 3 and 19).
- 7.3. Within Field B, northeast of the Oak Plantation, were a density of anomalies, some of which had been recorded in an earlier survey (Muller and Garcia Rovira 2021 Appendix I). This survey, expanding on the former, was able to

provide both an expanded view of the features, and also further detail of the internal character of the enclosures recorded by the NMP (Figure 3 and 19 - M8317). Based on the morphology of the cropmarks, they have been interpreted as the remains of a Roman settlement. Aerial photographs held by CUCAP and associated with this HER record include DW054-56, EX33 and EF030.

- 7.4. The survey also further enhanced cropmarks recorded by the NMP in Field C, as well as identified another linear anomaly that the NMP had not recorded (Figure 3 and 19 –M2958).
- 7.5. However, there were other areas within the survey boundary in which the geophysical survey did not identify any anomalies recorded by the NMP, such as in the northeast and southwest areas of Field B –or identified only faint anomalies corresponding to the NMP records, such as in Field A, where some anomalies corresponding to cropmarks were indistinct.
- 7.6. Reasons behind the masking of such anomalies could be due to the depth of soil sequences, which were reported on in a soil survey by L. Thomas in 2021. The report concluded that certain parts of the fields were covered in deeper alluvial soil sequences, sometimes exceeding more than 1m in depth. However, some of these deeper alluvial areas contained very clear anomalies in the geophysical survey. Other areas, recorded as shallower soil sequences, entirely masked the anomalies. The conclusion one may take from this is that perhaps it is not the alluvial layers that masked the archaeology but rather the magnetic susceptibility of the shallower soils. Much of the survey includes large amounts of magnetic debris.

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
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


Figure 2. Overall extent of survey.








Figure 3. Cropmarks recorded by the National Mapping Programme (NMP) within and adjecent to the proposed development boundary.






Figure 4. Results processed +-3nT (Stage 1-3)






Figure 5. Results processed +-3nT - annotated









Figure 6. Results annotated













































Field 13. Field C - results +-3nT

















Figure 17. Field D - annotated








Figure 19. HER records within and adjacent to the proposed development boundary.

In February 2021, Archaeology England Ltd carried out a geophysical survey at land to the west of Kelham, Nottinghamshire at the request of The Sirius Group. The aim of the geophysical survey was to determine the nature and extent of any buried archaeological features located within 18 hectares of land centred on SK 76640 55525.

The survey documented two areas containing the remains of past activity which directly link to cropmarks evidenced in aerial photography and recorded in the Historic Environment Records. No archaeological activity was recorded during the survey in the NE region of the field.

The work was carried out to the Standard and Guidance set out by the Chartered Institute for Archaeologists for Archaeological Geophysical Survey (CIfA 2015) and completed in accordance with EAC Guidelines for the Use of Geophysics in Archaeology (Historic England 2016).

- 1.1. From the 1st to the 13th of February 2021, Archaeology England Ltd carried out a geophysical survey at land to the west of Kelham, Nottinghamshire (NRG SK 76640 55525). The survey was undertaken as part of a staged approach of archaeological investigations into a wider scheme. The aim of the survey was to provide with a better understanding of the nature and precise location of the archaeological resource of the area. Stage 1 targeted 18 hectares of land located immediately west of Kelham (Figure 1).
- 1.2. The work was managed by Irene Garcia Rovira MCIfA, AW Project Manager, and the site work was undertaken by Jennifer Muller, Lucy Bagshaw, Daniel Moore and Christopher Lindesay.
- 1.3. All work conformed to the *Standard and Guidance for Geophysical Survey* (CIfA December 2015) and was undertaken by suitably qualified staff to the highest professional standards.

- 2.1. The site is located to the west of the village of Kelham, Nottinghamshire and c. 3.8km to the north-east of Newark-upon-Trent. These deposits formed up to 3 million years ago in the Quaternary Period (BGS 2021).

along zig-zag and parallel traverses spaced at 1m intervals, recording data points spaced at 0.25m intervals to a maximum instrument sensitivity of 0.1nT in accordance with Historic England Guidelines. The survey mode was set to bi-directional (traverses walked alternately north/south). Incomplete survey lines resulting from irregular area boundaries or obstacles were completed using the 'dummy log' key. At regular intervals, the data was downloaded in the field onto a laptop computer for storage and assessment.

Data Processing and Presentation

- 4.6. The final results have been presented at an appropriate scale tied to the Ordnance Survey National Grid.
- 4.7. The most typical method of visualising the data is as a greyscale image. In a greyscale plot, each data point is represented as a shade of grey, from black to white at either extreme of the data range. A limited number of standard operations can be carried out to process the data, including clipping, destriping and graduated shade. The data was analysed using a variety of parameters and styles and the most useful of these were saved as *TIF images and displayed using Adobe Illustrator software. The results of the survey were then overlaid onto a digital map of the study area. This was then used to produce interpretation figures.
- 4.8. All works were undertaken in accordance with the standard required by The Chartered Institute for Archaeologist's *Standard and Guidance for Archaeological Geophysical Survey* (2014) and current Health and Safety legislation.

5. Known archaeological assets

- 5.1. A number of cropmarks are known to exist within and around the area surveyed, and it has therefore deemed necessary to examine the data in order to contextualise the results of the survey. To do so, a search was carried out within the local HER, focusing on the known assets located 1km around SK 76469 55516 (Figure 2; Appendix 1).
- 5.2. Six HER records fall within the surveyed area: MNT17087, MNT9645, MNT17089, MNT8241, MNT17090 and MNT9643. Except for MNT9645, all records document cropmarks identified in aerial photography.

MNT 17087 - Settlement at Averham

- 5.3. This record documents the presence of a number of cropmarks located half a mile north from Averham, evidenced in a number of aerial photographs. The HER record is defined by a polygon which reaches the interior of the survey area. Aerial photographs evidencing this area document at least two square enclosures (see ASN60-1), as well as a number of linear features running toward the survey area from the south where a concentration of features is located. The latter is clearly evidenced in photograph BZF22 located at the Cambridge University Collection of Aerial Photographs (CUCAP)¹.
- 5.4. This record is associated to MNT9645 which corresponds to a find assemblage retrieved during the 1950s. Building material was found, however further details are not available as the report has been misplaced. MNT 17089 – Roman Settlement at Averham
- 5.5. This record documents the presence of a number of cropmarks evidenced in a number of aerial photographs. The HER record notes that according to their morphology are best interpreted as the remains of a Roman settlement. The features are recorded in the HER as a polygon partly located within the eastern part of the survey area. Aerial photographs held by CUCAP and associated with this HER record include DW054-56, EX33 and EF030. No

access to the photographs existed at the time of writing, however, a high density of cropmarks associated with this HER have been identified during the survey (see below).

MNT17090 - Settlement at Kelham

- 5.6. This record documents the presence of a number of cropmarks also evidenced in a number of aerial photographs. The HER record notes that according to their morphology are best interpreted as the remains of a Roman settlement. The features are recorded in the HER as a polygon partly located within the northern part of the survey area. Aerial photographs held by CUCAP associated with this HER record include DW054.
- 5.7. This record is associated to MNT8241. The latter evidenced a square-like feature observed in aerial photograph DW054 and located toward the northern end of the surveyed area.

6. Geophysics results (Figure 3-5; Plates 1-6)

Limitations

- 6.1. The survey was undertaken during a period of cold, wintry weather which included rain and snow, and sometimes strong winds.
- 6.2. The surveyed area was a relatively flat site, with a slight incline towards the centre of the field. Due to recent heavy rainfall and local flooding, some areas of the site were waterlogged, especially the north and western ends, as well as the centre of the field to the south. Some of these areas were partly surveyed.

Results

- 6.3. The survey identified several anomalies of probable archaeological origin.

 These and other visible anomalies will be described below as Features 1-7.
- 6.4. The survey also recorded a large amount of magnetic debris throughout the site. This is comprised of many dipolar anomalies, which are positive points with a negative response, or vice versa. The grouping together of this debris reveals bands of magnetic sands and gravel running through the field.

6.5. Other, single dipolar anomalies recorded throughout the survey may represent either isolated ferrous detritus, or thermoremanent magnetic materials, such as fragments of burnt stone, brick or tile.

Feature 1

- 6.6. Running along the boundaries of the field at the north, north-west and southern end is a linear feature which appears as a black line with a parallel white line running alongside it (F1). These are representative of topographical change on the surface of the field, where the ground level abruptly changes in height. Positive magnetic anomalies (the black line) usually represent cut, in-filled features, in which a greater amount of magnetic soil has collected compared to the soils into which it has been cut; negative magnetic anomalies (the white line) display a lower magnetic response than the native soil around them and are often indicative of the remains of positive landforms, such as earthen banks. This feature was visible to the operators, and looks like a boundary between the edge of the field which has been left unploughed and the central, ploughed part of the field. Feature 2
- 6.7. Intersecting F1 at the western end of the field is another positive linear, represented as a black linear (F2) running on both sides of F1. This indicates a cut, in-filled feature in the ground. However, because of its location along the boundary of the ploughed and unploughed parts of the field, it is slightly unclear whether this is related to the boundary, or could be an archaeological

feature cut by the boundary.

- 6.8. Present throughout the majority of the field running north-west/south-east are faintly visible, parallel lines of alternating positive and negative responses (F3). These are plough marks, and are visible to the naked eye. Only a sample of these is annotated on Figure 5 so as not to obscure the rest of the features. Feature 4
- 6.9. At the south-west end of the field is a wavy positive response with an associated negative response (F4). The magnetic response varies in strength but is generally weak. This is likely a natural feature, where water has

probably formed a deep channel. It appears to be running towards the rhine that lines the southwestern side of the field. F4 may curve to the south towards the 'Cottage Plantation' trees at the southwest end of the field, where the magnetic response continues to vary from low to high readings, though it is not entirely clear if this is the same feature due to lack of coverage by the survey. The area immediately east of F4 was water-logged and too deep to survey. It is possible that F4 was formed from regular flooding of this part of the field. However, its proximity to the modern service pipe (F5) could indicate the pipe carries/d water and is draining it in this area.

Feature 5

6.10. A bipolar linear, one that has strong alternating positive and negative responses, runs through the field in a north-east/south-west direction, then changes to a more north/south direction after a break in the line (F5). This is likely a metallic service pipe. The southern end of the pipe appears broken into separate pieces (easier to view in Figure 5: raw data). These breaks could indicate that not all of the pipe is metal, though there is no clear visual indication of anything in between these sections. It is possible that the pipe is broken and perhaps no longer in use.

Feature 6

6.11. Feature 6 comprises another linear just to the north of F5, which also runs north-east/south-west. It appears made up of many individual dipoles, and could represent a land drain, which has a weaker signal than a metal service, but due to the firing of the clay can have a permanent magnetic signature. It appears displaced where it intersects with F5, which could mean that it was put into the ground earlier than F5 and may have been altered by the action of inserting the metallic pipe.

Feature 7

6.12. Grouped in the south-eastern end of the field are a series of weak positive linears and points, which make up two distinct areas of activity (F7). The positive linears are probable ditches, though it is possible that some of these positive linears represent robbed-out wall foundations, especially on

the feature at the east side, which has straighter, more magnetic positive boundaries.

- 6.13. The feature towards the western side, marked in red, appears to be an incomplete rectangular enclosure. Within it, spaced equidistant from each end, are two positive points, indicative of infilled, cut features; further within the enclosure are three more positive points of note spaced somewhat regularly from each other in a circular fashion. These could be pits or postholes. Because of the pipeline to the west (F5), it is difficult to determine whether the enclosure continues; the strong responses from the pipe will mask anomalies near it. The northern end of this enclosure is cut off abruptly by a modern feature (within the green square indicating dummy values), which is a man-made mound with a pipe sticking vertically out of it.
- 6.14. Faint curvilinears running east from the rectangular enclosure are so ephemeral they could be unrelated to the feature, but they do not align with modern plough marks, and their proximity to the feature makes them conspicuous. All positive linears and points outside of the rectangular enclosure that are suspected archaeology have been marked with light blue. Those within the feature marked with blue have a significantly weaker response and could be from a different phase, or could be just more ephemeral in nature.
- 6.15. The grouping of linears on the east side continue outside of the survey. What is most apparent from this grouping is that some of the linears have a stronger magnetic response than others, and could represent different phases of activity. Therefore, weaker responses have been lined with a peach colour, while the stronger responses are marked with red. There are also a number of positive points within these linear features which could be pits or postholes.

7. Discussion and conclusions

7.1. The works carried out by Archaeology England in February 2021 focused on surveying 18 hectares of land located to the west of Kelham, known to hold

- archaeological potential. The aim of the survey was to establish with further precision the location and nature of the archaeological remains.
- 7.2. HER record MNT17089 notes the presence of a number of cropmarks situated within and adjacent to the south-east region of the area surveyed. Based on the morphology of the cropmarks, the latter have been interpreted as the remains of a Roman settlement. Aerial photographs held by CUCAP and associated with this HER record include DW054-56, EX33 and EF030.
- 7.3. The presence and precise location of the cropmarks were identified during the survey Feature 7. These are located to the east of Feature 5 modern pipe. A number of linear features as well as evidence for postholes are defined in the results and though they seem to run further to the south-east, there is no indication that the remains run north and of the pipe.
- 7.4. HER record MNT 17087 also document the presence of a number of cropmarks mainly located to the south-east of the surveyed area, sometimes running towards the fields surveyed. Aerial photographs evidencing this area document at least two square enclosures (see ASN60-1), as well as a number of linear features running toward the survey area from the south.
- 7.5. Contrastingly to the results obtained for Feature 7, HER record MNT17087 was not picked up in its entirety during the geophysical survey. While the reason behind this situation is difficult to pinpoint with clarity, it seems plausible to indicate that some features may be masked by alluvial layers known to exist within the surveyed area. A borehole survey from 1972 (BGS ID: 238970; BGS Reference: SK75NE88), located immediately west of the rhine which borders the site at its north-west corner, reported alluvium 1.7m deep (BGS 2021). The depth of alluvium, along with the high water table, can have an adverse effect on the magnetic signal (Gaffney et al 2002).
- 7.6. Contrasting to the situation described thus far, it is worth noting the lack of archaeological remains located toward the centre and the north and north-east region of the site. Whilst the possible effects of alluvial deposition cannot be altogether discarded, it is likely that this area has remained unimpacted through time and could therefore be targeted as an area with potential for development. Further archaeological investigations in the form of intrusive

initiatives—trenching evaluation—are recommended in this area to examine the presence/absence and nature of remains that might exist within this area.




Figure 1. Location of survey (green).






Figure 2. HERs within 1km of search area.






Figure 3. Survey Results processed






Figure 4. Survey Results annotated






Figure 5: Survey Results raw

The Sutton family of nearby Averham had been Lords of the Manor at Kelham since the thirteenth century. There had been a house on the site well before the Civil War. The Sanderson map of 1835 shows the hall with a rectangular field to the south, a large pond and a belt of tree planting to the west. The open fields to the north and south of the pond appear to be planted with parkland trees. After a fire a new hall was built 1859-1861 and William Andrews Nesfield was commissioned c.1860 to prepare plans for the pleasure grounds of the Hall. Nesfield's design for a set of steps on the Bastion of the 'South Garden' dated July 23rd, 1860 were constructed and still exist as per plan. He prepared recommendations and a plan of a 'Geometric Garden' and pleasure ground. The ground plan for the parterre in the Geometric Garden still exists, although the plan for the pleasure ground does not. He also made recommendations concerning a grand entrance court and a riverside arboretum. It is thought that neither of these proposals were executed. The landscape prior to Nesfield was well developed with features such as the eighteenth century ha-ha and tree belts. It would appear that he extended and interplanted the western tree belts as they are very varied and still contain a good number of arboretum specimens. In 1903 the hall became a theological college for the Society of the Sacred Mission. They rented the site at first and then eventually bought the freehold in 1919. It is thought that they carried out extensive orchard planting at the junction of the King's Walk and the Long Walk. The hall and the grounds remained in the ownership of the Society until it was purchased by the newly created Newark & Sherwood District Council in November 1973. (2)

Description and Sources

Description

The Fox Inn is ...characterised by traditional, post-mediaeval Nottinghamshire brick and pantile architecture. The earliest identifiable phase is an east-west range, running from main bar-room back as far as the west wall of the modern bay extension to the east. At ground floor level, this phase is visibly represented by a bridging beam, orientated north-south, in the main bar-room which has double chamfers and step stops – the latter is unlikely to date to a period after the mid-eighteenth century and was common in lower status spaces throughout the post-mediaeval period (Hall 2005, 159). The post-mediaeval character is maintained in the oak, clasped purlin roof structure (with single dovetail halved jointed collars) of the east-west range which regionally dates to the period c 1500-1850 (Harris 2012, 65). The roof is divided into four unequal bays by collars, however, the rafters are all of similar dimension (c 95 x 105mm) with no obvious principle rafters present. There are two longitudinal spine beams comprised of reused timbers with relict mortices. The masonry of the chimney breast and eastern gable is comprised of bricks of dimension 112mm (breadth) x 55-60mm (thickness) x 235mm (length). The gable end is supported on skew-back corbels and projects well above the roofline -suggesting that the building was once that ched. The timber wall plate is visible externally on the north elevation. A single storey extension was added at the north-west end of the east-west range, probably somewhere in the eighteenth or nineteenth century and a chimney breast was also inserted, between the two structures, at this period. Possibly contemporary with this addition, or slightly later, is the brick north-south range which was added to the south-west of the earlier wing. This has un-chamfered, machine sawn beams and joists at ground floor level that cannot be earlier than the late eighteenth century. There are blocked doors and windows with segmental heads in the east elevation. The cornice has simple dentil brickwork. The roof structure of the north-south range is composed of simply split, softwood common rafters with spiked collars (rather than joints) -indicative of an eighteenth or nineteenth century date (Harris 2012, 83-6). A single storey, outshot pantile roof abuts the north-south range on its western elevation and covers a half-basement cellar featuring brick vaults at the northern end. This build was in situ by the later nineteenth century as it appears on the 1880 Ordnance Survey map. It was later extended further to the west (Jonathan Pass, pers. comm. 19/03/2019). During the twentieth and twenty-first centuries brick extensions were added to the building – a narrow range immediately to the west of the east-west range was then abutted by two later, rectilinear, builds; a bay extension was added to the east end of the range and a new L-shaped porch was added in the angle of the north-south and east-west ranges. Three concealed artefacts were discovered during recent renovations (Jonathan Pass, pers. comm. 19/03/2019): a dried cat was uncovered in the roof structure of the western outshot roof and was put back in situ after photography. Two very worn leather shoes were found in the roof structure of the east-west range, but were discarded without record. Such artefacts have been studied extensively in recent years and growing evidence points towards their deliberate deposition as part of rituals associated with averting evil and bringing good luck to a building (Hoggard 2016, 106-117; Swann 2016, 118-130).
