RPC/58/22	Apologies for absence: There were no absences.	
RPC/59/22	<b>Declarations of interest:</b> There were no declarations of interest, direct or indirect, in any items of business on the agenda.

RPC/61/22	Parkwood Leisure Report: Councillors noted that Parkwood was working with NCC in relation to the Ford to improve the situation.  The following were raised and discussed: a. The condition of the dog bins. Parkwood will clean these. b. Brambles overgrowing the paths and other areas. Parkwood will cut these back. c. Noise from the park at night. Councillors noted that the park closes at 5 pm so there should be no-one on the site except those staying in the holiday flat. d. The public footpath from the Rose Cottage entrance is blocked. Parkwood will clear the obstruction.

RPC/65/22	Reports from district and county councillors: Mr Carlton reported as follows:  1. Via, the police, NCC and Parkwood Leisure are all working together to address the issues at the Ford. The police presence has been raised the previous weekend with a number of vehicles being pulled over.  2. The sluice gate opening had revealed communication issues with Parkwood and NCC flood planning, NCC being the landowner of the park.  3. Since the sluice gate issue, NCC had been taking a more proactive approach to the park and anti-social activities.  4. Mr Carlton had requested the installation of bollards on the green verge to prevent people parking to record film footage to be posted online.	

RPC/66/22	<ol> <li>NSDC is looking at legal options to impose a community protection order.</li> <li>The asset management team has been tasked with repairing the perimeter fence around the park to improve the security of the site.</li> <li>Consideration is being given to installing bollards to prevent access to the sluice gate.</li> <li>A safety assessment is underway in relation to a proposal to install rubber bumps on the approach to the Ford to slow traffic. These would initially be temporary but could be made permanent if they proved effective.</li> <li>English Heritage also potentially have an interest in the issue.</li> <li>There is a concern that if the viewing platform is removed sightseers will just relocate to an more dangerous position. However, warning signage is being increased for visitors.</li> <li>A614 improvements are on course although there are inflationary concerns. Geology testing is currently underway.</li> <li>Mr Carlton noted councillors' concerns that Rufford Lane will become a rat run once the works begin.</li> </ol> Reports from Councillors: No reports.
